

Continuing Education Requirements for Montana Licensed Social Workers (And How to Stay on Track)

As a licensed clinical social worker (LCSW) in the state of Montana, it is your responsibility to adhere to continuing education requirements each period in order to renew your license. Beyond license renewal being key to you maintaining your practice, continuing education is essential to stay abreast of what is happening in your field – something your clients will always appreciate you taking seriously. Education is how we all continue to learn and further hone our skills and expertise, so it's certainly something to be celebrated. Though education is fantastic, keeping on track with the many hours you need to fulfill can be a challenge. Thankfully, there is a fantastic resource available to help you with that. Before we dive into the resource, let's start by outlining what is required of Montana LCSWs in order to renew their license.

Licensee Requirements for Montana Licensed Social Workers

Licensed clinical social workers in Montana are held to the exact same continuing education requirements as their MFT colleagues. LCSWs in Montana are required to complete 20 hours of continuing education every year, with two hours in suicide prevention specifically. Should a licensee exceed the required 20 hours, they are permitted to roll up to 20 into the next year. *Note: 50% of licensees are subject to being audited every licensing cycle, so it is advised licensees keep record of their continuing education certificates for at least three years*. Though there is a lot of flexibility regarding how continuing education credits are fulfilled, no more than 10 hours can be obtained through authoring a professional journal or preparing a new course. Otherwise, continuing education is likely to be accepted if the following are true: it directly relates to social work, the education reviews existing concepts/techniques, it reinforces professional ethics and conduct, and it improves upon the knowledge of the practice.
